Send information related to school and parent and/or family programs, meetings, and other activities to the parents and/or families in a format and language they can understand through newsletters, PTA meetings, school improvement council, meetings, school calendar, parent/student handbook, and student agenda.
- III. Wilder Elementary will provide the following necessary coordination, technical assistance, and other support from the Principal, Assistant Principal, Instructional Coach, Guidance Counselor, Social Worker, and Title One Director to assist Title I, Part A schools in planning and implementing effective parental and family engagement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance.
